"You are going to see law enforcement take a hit because we rely on hundreds of millions of dollars to support our police," he said. "Public health will take a huge hit. That is almost an entirely federal grant-funded department."

Lopez argues the city should again consider amending its Welcoming City ordinance. The city council earlier this year struck down a proposal that reportedly would have granted exceptions when undocumented residents are arrested or convicted of selling and buying drugs, prostitution, human trafficking and "sexual crimes involving minors."

Executive Director's Report

More winning, please

As gun owners, we have a lot to be thankful for since last November. We have an ally of gun rights in the White House. President Trump's nominees to key posts are all pretty solid on guns. Perfect? No. But don't let perfection become the enemy of good.

AG Pam Bondi "demilitarized" ATF, sending its door kickers over to ICE and DHS to do immigration enforcement. Talk about a win - win for gun owners and Americans in general. What's more, that assignment may become permanent.

Before he left as ATF's Acting Director, Kash Patel reversed Biden's "Zero Tolerance" policy which revoked federal firearms licenses for dealers who made trivial clerical errors on paperwork. What's more, other "policies" and "rules" are now under scrutiny and likely to be revamped if not repealed.

At the Department of Justice, they've taken over firearm rights restoration from ATF. More importantly, AG Bondi set up the Second Amendment Task Force within the DOJ's Civil Rights Division.

If this isn't just "talk" - and plenty of embedding lawfare operatives have done their best to undermine Team Trump at every turn - then we may soon see legal action targeting some of these unconstitutional gun control schemes passed by the gun control jihadists in our state. Here's to purging the deep state actors at the DOJ. Because until they're gone, little substantive will change.

In other good news, ICE continues to round up the worst of the worst criminal illegals and send them home. Or to El Salvador's famous gang prison. With each violent predator swept up, our streets are safer for our families, friends and neighbors.

Yes, most of the good news is coming from the federal end of things.

In Illinois, all manner of gun control schemes are in play in the General Assembly. Sadly, we don't have the votes to stop them. As we've covered recently, we can't even keep the entire supposedly pro-gun Republican caucus from voting for gun control - and even gun confiscation schemes!

If it makes you feel better, make a trip down

to Springfield for IGOLD on May 14, 2025. For more information, visit ISRA.org. Right now though, at the present time, the courts are really our only hope for rolling back gun control in our state. And we know who owns the Illinois Supreme Court... While Trump 2.0 is reforming the federal judiciary one appointment at a time, we still have no shortage of insurrectionist jurists. Coupled with a US Supreme Court that seems unwilling to deal with the legal insurrection in progress, we're kind of stuck.

Trade policies.

If you're not aware of the tariffs enacted by Team Trump to help incentivize companies to bring production and manufacturing back to America, then you're probably not a GSL member. (You should join, we'll keep you informed.)

Why is that relevant to you? If you want to buy a foreign made firearm, or gun food, you might want to get that sooner rather than later. Imported guns and ammo are going up in price very soon.

Also, we're sold on the utility of having a backup form of communication as part of emergency preparations to help turn disasters and emergencies into mere inconveniences. Those inexpensive Baofeng two-way hand-held radios like the UV-5R are an exceptionally good value presently. With the 125% tariff in place on future Chinese imports (and still more duties on *de minimus* orders direct from China - think Temu), these radios aren't going to be available for \$20-30 much longer.

Buy them, along with the appropriate mobile/car radios, spare batteries, and better antennas. Get what you need while stuff is still dirt cheap. While like many I prefer "Made in America," I just can't afford Motorola products that cost 20x as much. Many of our readers are also likely in the same boat.

The bottom line: positive changes are happening. It's hard to keep up with them. So, like with other aspects of life, be thankful for what and who you have in your life. At GSL, we're working hard to make life better for gun owners, but Rome wasn't built in a day. Join with us to help us continue our mission getting proven results and change will come.

Congressman Darin LaHood pledges to work with Congressional members to increase civil rights legal fee reimbursements

(GSL) - At GSL, we've been in contact with Congressman Darin LaHood, a strong friend of gun owners. We've been lobbying him to file legislation to increase the legal fee reimbursements to private parties who successfully win civil rights legal actions against local, state and federal government units that violate our civil rights.

We suggested increasing the standard reimbursement for prevailing parties from straight up legal fees to double or triple the fees. That would have a two-fold impact: It would make legislating against the Constitution and black letter law more expensive for these government units, but it would also provide much needed resources for the legal firms handling the cases.

With that extra money, pro-gun attorneys could file additional court actions against other problematic rules, regulations and laws. And the cycle could continue. Heaven knows there is plenty of room for more lawsuits to knock down more ineffective gun control schemes, especially in Illinois.

In fairness, Rep. LaHood isn't promising us the moon on this, but he's working with key members of Congress to make this happen. What's more, if the proposal is written to include all successful civil rights actions, it would possibly gain support from Democrats to make it a truly bipartisan bill.

Stop treating the Second Amendment as a second-class right

ISRA asking AG Pam Bondi, Department of Justice to review gun control schemes in IL

(The Center Square) – Gun rights advocates in Illinois are asking the U.S. attorney general to come and review how the state may be violating residents' Second Amendment



Attorney General Pam Bondi was recently quoted saying the Second Amendment is not a second-class right after investigating delays in gun permits being issued in California. She said the U.S. Department of Justice will not stand idly by while states and localities infringe on the Second Amendment rights of ordinary, law-abiding Americans.

Illinois State Rifle Association's Ed Sullivan said they've been in talks with the Trump administration.

"I think it's timely that Attorney General Bondi would want to come in and talk to us," Sullivan told The Center Square. "She should tackle kind of the most onerous states in the nation when it comes to anti-gun laws and so we certainly welcome anything that they want to do to kind of look at this process."

Several Illinois gun laws, including the state's ban on certain guns and the Firearm Owner's ID card, are tied up in federal and state litiga-

owners would have to lock up their firearms anywhere they are under a measure that passed the Illinois Senate late Thursday.

Senate Bill 8 found lopsided support among the public. As of Thursday evening, 710 individuals filed witness slips in favor. About 3,200 people filed in opposition. The deadline to move the bill to the House was Friday.

"The act does not apply in instances of self defense or

(The Center Square) – Gun unlawful entry onto those premises," said bill sponsor state Sen. Laura Ellman, D-Naperville. "It amends the Criminal Code of 2012 similarly to provide that it is unlawful for any person to store or leave a firearm if the person knows or reasonably should know that a minor who does not have a [Firearm Owner's ID] card is likely to gain access.

> Minor is defined in the bill as anyone under 18.

Opposing the measure in

committee, gun rights advocate Todd Vandermyde said it goes beyond just requiring safe storage by adding penalties for if a stolen firearm is used against someone

"So if a report is filed and it's a petty offense, you're now lowering the bar to losing a constitutional right based on a petty offense," Vandermyde told the committee. "I think that is some very intriguing new ground.

Former CCW 'instructor' catches felony for corner-cutting classes

Springfield, IL (WCIA) — A Springfield woman has pleaded guilty to falsifying training certificates for concealed carry holders.

Illinois Attorney General Kwame Raoul's office reported 37-year-old Tayana Henderson pleaded guilty to one count of forgery (a Class 3 felony) and one count of violating the Firearm Concealed Carry Act (a Class A misdemeanor).

Henderson worked as an instructor who trained others seeking to obtain concealed carry licenses. Prosecutors said she falsified certificates by claiming applicants had completed the legally required 16 hours of training when they had not.

AG Bondi's new 2A Task Force should target these 12 states' gun rights violations first

(CCRKBA) - As U.S. Attorney General Pam Bondi sets the course of action for the Justice Department's newlyannounced "Second Amendment Task Force,' the Citizens Committee for the Right to Keep and Bear Arms has suggested in a letter that she unleash the new group on a dozen Democrat-controlled states which have adopted extremely restrictive gun control laws

In his letter to Bondi, CCRKBA Chairman Alan Gottlieb writes, "I would like to suggest that among the Task Force's priorities might be to examine the patterns of egregious Second Amendment violations in the states of

California, Colorado, Connecticut, Hawaii, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New Mexico, New York, Oregon and Washington. All of these states have adopted laws in recent years which have essentially relegated Second Amendment rights to the level of government-regulated privileges.'

by John Boch (GSL) - Some of us are lucky enough to save lives with the work we do. John Purviance (purr-VY-ance) counts himself in that category as a long-time (now retired) ISP firearms and tactics instructor.

How do they train their raw recruits at the ISP Academy on how to win a gunfight? After all, today's applicants are a lot like your average gun owner and some don't even have guns. First and foremost, the ISP trainers try to acclimate their cadets to high stress situations.

They do this through simulators and force-on-force training. They tailor their training to research done by the leading national experts, giving their cadets (and Troopers with continuing education) every possible edge and advantage to help them win. All things that the average concealed carry holder should try to avail themselves to in training.

Now obviously ISP trains for de-escalation and conflict resolution without going lethal (as we all should) but sometimes drug-addled, or desperate people do irrational, desperate things. Especially when they don't want to go to jail.

Mr. Purviance explained some common physical and psychological effects people feel during adrenaline dumps. While they vary wildly in specifics, but generally fine motor skills go out the window and very often there is a time distortion.

Accordingly, ISP trains their people to exploit both aspects by drilling on gross motor skills in using the gun and using the temporal distortion (time goes in slow motion) to think about tactics instead of how to manipulate their weapon, radio, etc.

The former trainer also talked about how people - cops, good guys, etc. must all break out of the denial response - aka "this can't be happening" - and take action when things go sideways. Break the brain's denial response as quickly as possible in order to take life-saving action. He discussed tunnel vision and

the importance of breaking it, along with auditory exclusion (where your brain tunes out sounds to focus on the threat) and a host of other common psychological effects of that massive adrenaline dump that you'll

It proved a very insightful discussion of mindset and how everyday people can train and condition themselves to better react to an unfolding deadly force incident.

He also tackled pre-decision making on when you'll get involved in a third-party self-defense situation. It might be never vs. early in a confrontation. It's something you have to decide for yourself. And it can vary depending on who's with you. It should be very different if you're flying solo vs. if you have your toddler kids or grandkids with you out in public. Decide what you can live with as opposed to what vou can't.



That includes what you are willing to risk to stop a potentially lethal attack upon someone else.

For example you might duck out the back of a store if you discern a robbery at the cash register up front, but you might engage if you're on a playground and someone starts shooting kids. Or you might let the homeless bums duke it out with broken bottles, but take action if you see what appears to be some guy trying to abduct a



Holster up as soon as vou can. Conceal the gun and have your hands up when police roll up.

Purviance even discussed post-shooting interactions with responding and investigating cops. First and foremost, put the gun away after you've scanned for immediate threats. You not only have to worry about other criminals, but also fellow concealed carry holders and off-duty cops. So break the tunnel vision (and auditory exclusion) and holster up. Ideally well before cops

You own non-threatening behavior goes a long way to ensuring your safety when police arrive. Expect to get cuffed up and treated like a criminal until officers figure out what happened.



He recommends telling the cops, "I acted in self-defense. I don't want to answer any questions without my attorney. My info on my driver's license in my wallet is current." And then shut up.

It was a priceless presentation, one you would be wise to hear in Peoria in May. Yes, Mr. Purviance will be our featured speaker there in May. Why you might even want to take some notes.

March for Our Lives crumbles: David Hogg's gun-grabbers reminded how Americans won't surrender their rights without a fight

(Bearing Arms) - The anti-gun crusade just took a well-deserved hit. March for Our Lives, David Hogg's darling of the left's war on the Second Amendment, has laid off most of its staff—15 out of 18 employees gone in a flash.

This isn't a "pause"—it's a collapse, and it's proof the pro-liberty, America-First spirit is winning.

Founded after the 2018 Parkland shooting, March for Our Lives rode a wave of media hype, pushing radical ideas like banning "assault weapons" and turning law-abiding gun owners into villains. They raked in millions—\$5.8 million in 2022 alone thanks to sob stories and Bloomberg's deep pockets.

But money can't buy relevance. Their big "restructuring" excuse? A "changing political landscape." Translation: Trump's back, Republicans are flexing, and the red wave in Congress has their agenda dead

in the water. Even their own data shows the truth—gun ownership's up, concealed carry's soaring, and their pet laws are stalling out nationwide.

Let's not kid ourselves—this group was never about "safety." It was about control. They wanted to disarm Americans while ignoring the real problems: mental health failures, soft-on-crime DAs, and a culture that coddles thugs. Their layoffs hit hardest in the "organizing" department—seven of nine gone—because grassroots support never materialized. Turns out, regular folks in flyover country don't take kindly to elitists telling them to give up their God-given rights. The NRA's still standing tall, and concealed-carry permits hit 23 million last year. That's the real America talking.

The left's melting down over this, of course. X is buzzing with their tears—some call it a "gut punch" to gun control. Good. Every patriot knows the Second Amendment isn't negotiable, and March for Our Lives's flop shows the tide's turning.

Trump's victory, paired with a GOP Congress ready to protect gun rights, has these activists scrambling. They're down to a skeleton crew of three, and their "new vision" sounds like a desperate Hail Mary. Maybe they'll pivot to something usefullike supporting armed school guards—but don't hold your breath.

This is what happens when you bet against freedom. Americans aren't sheep; we're armed, proud, and ready to defend our way of life. March for Our Lives thought they could guilt us into submission. Instead, they're broke, irrelevant, and a cautionary tale for every anti-gun busybody. The Constitution stands, and under Trump's watch, it's not going anywhere. Time to celebrate a win for the good guys-pass the ammo.

It's FUN!

One disclaimer: I don't get paid to write this column. No firearms company comps me; no shooting range gives me a free pass. Pay for my own GSL annual membership.

One confession: I've experienced hundreds of firearms' training sessions – some good; some not so good. In the Army I got to fire tanks, howitzers, machine guns, light antitank weapons and the usual rifles and pistols - never paid for a single round. Thanks to all you tax-payers who did! So hopefully I know what bad training looks like as well as good.

The Illinois Concealed Carry License renewal class I took at The Bullet Trap could have been a boring affair - perhaps endless text slides so small you can't read them, accompanied by a droning voice that would cause even a 1960s hippie on a big dose of LSD to fall into a deep sleep. The class at Macon was none of that, and to my surprise consisted of much more than just a presentation, and then going to the range and trying to hit 21 shots out of 30 on that "Ray Charles" target, aptly nicknamed, because even "Hit the Road Jack" Ray would have hit it. The event did start in the classroom for maybe 45 minutes. Gary taught it. He kept my interest the whole time; he has a good voice; he's funny but doesn't waste time.

Then we went next door to the indoor range where Gary and Rick surprised the seven of us, issuing a SIRT (Shot Indicating Resetting Trigger) Laser Training Pistol to each, along with a composite training waist holster and showed us how to use both. Then we walked out to the middle of the range and after watching them, learned how to draw the weapon - while keeping your finger away from the trigger - bring it up, and initially take 3 aimed shots at the paper target in front of you. The green laser dot shows you where an actual bullet would have hit.

Then came a real highlight - learning how to point the weapon quickly and fire 3 rounds without using the sights. Why? Because it's faster. And we were about to find out how fast is fast. The range has a sophisticated system of spotlights for each lane. Rick would turn off the lights. Remember, this part is not live fire; there are no actual firearms anywhere near you.

With the lights off, it is not pitch black, but an old geezer like me wouldn't want to walk around. With no warning, a spotlight il**luminates your Thompson Target Center-Fire** Defender XL 19" x 25" yellow human upper silhouette target a few yards in front of you. You fire your three laser "shots" in the six seconds the target is illuminated before the spotlight goes off. You'll see where you hit, and do that several times. Then the engagement time gets compressed to 5, then 4, then 3 and finally 2 seconds. Draw, point and shoot, because you have no time to draw, aim and fire. The experience teaches you something no book or video could. There's no pass or fail here. Remember: someday there may be in real life.

Then back to the firing line, where you put away the SIRT and uncased your actual weapon, which you will later qualify with.

Rick explains it all. You make five piles, each of three rounds on the shelf in front of you in your lane. I put three rounds in my 9mm

magazine, loaded it into the weapon and chambered the first round. Everyone then fires five different point-and-shoot distances, each with three rounds. Your weapon is never holstered in this: it starts safely in your hands pointed just below your silhouette down range. This does two things. You get to practice firing quickly - something most ranges do not allow on most days. You also get rid of any anxiety about later qualifying, because these results are not part of that.



Then comes the ginormous, gargantuan, gigantic Thompson Target Center-Fire B27Q-RED XXL - 25" x 38" target that you mount on the target frame in your lane - and you KNOW you can do this! Everyone will be firing on their own lanes at once; no time limit. No one staring at you. Rick, using a microphone so you can hear him with your hearing protection, has you load three 10-round magazines (or one magazine three successive times). You'll fire the first magazine at a range of 15 feet, the second at 21 feet; the third at 30 feet. That's it. They'll score your target later and you can take it home. Some shooters had .22s; one a revolver; most had 9mm semis. Use what's comfortable and accurate for you.

Then back to the classroom, including several videos; one analyzing an actual church shooting; another showing how not to draw your pistol (SPOILER ALERT: the guy shoots himself in the leg). What concealed carry means in Illinois. What you can do; what you can't. Where you can carry; where not. What to say when you call 911 after a selfdefense shooting. What to say if an officer pulls you over and you have a weapon. No legal mumbo-jumbo. It's all understandable. Stuff that will keep you out of jail. I learned things. Sure hope I never have to shoot anyone. But I am much more prepared if that situation arises, because of the time I spent at this course and what we practiced.

You can do this. Having a CCL doesn't mean you have to carry. It means that you can conceal carry if you need to. Having options is always good. Take a good Concealed Carry Course - like this one. Get, and keep up to date, a Concealed Carry License. Your life may depend on it.

John Bush | 'Proactive maintenance'

In Mattoon, John Bush spoke about what he called proactive maintenance. He had a bad experience duck hunting with an expensive shotgun, a gun that shouldn't have failed him in a duck blind. Turns out it was a part malfunction and he repaired it at home.

He says he now likes to clean and minimally oil his guns and run them to failure to get an idea of how long they will run with little to no cleaning, lubrication, etc. He calls it his torture test. He's had some nicer guns fail after a time, and some more affordable guns run just as long or longer before failing.

When he indicated that does for his defensive carry guns he immediately got some pushback from the audience. It left some folks scratching their heads. To each their own. Torture tests are fine, just not with something you're counting on to save your life. Guns, like engines in a car, run better with proper lubrication and maintenance.

Bush did have a point about having some spare parts. That goes double for

those pesky PICA-regulated guns we aren't supposed to have at the moment. Bush also mentioned, quite correctly, that there are people carrying guns defensively that they purchased but never even fired. That's never a good idea.

Our tech time speaker, Clyde Carceres, offered a suggestion for assessing how reliable some common guns are. Clyde suggested going to the gun rental counter at indoor ranges and asking how well certain rental guns are holding up in that role. Also ask them if there are any they would avoid. Or talk with the owner of the indoor range and see if they'll give you an honest answer.

An influential voice in advancing armed self-defense 'North of I-80'

John Drummond | The OODA Loop and Situational Awareness

One of GSL's famous YouTube personalities joined us in Decatur. John Drummond of Wayward Son Custom Guns - a nominee for the Breakout Creator of the Year at the National Gundie Awards, spoke of how people should use the OODA loop (Observe, Orient, Decide and Act) in their daily lives to maintain awareness.

Observe your surroundings. Use your intuition as well as all of your senses to look for these things that seem out of the ordinary.

Orient yourself to things outside of the baseline of normalcy. Someone acting or walking without a sense of purpose? Loitering? Impaired (mentally or by substance abuse)?

Decide on what to do if things continue to go sideways, including a plan for evading a potential perp. Identify exits, potential weapons, create a plan to escape or counter-attack.

Lastly, **Act** to execute your plan.

A couple of folks in the audience made some observations. A fellow instructor by the name of John Boch noted that bad guys use the OODA loop to identify potential victims and to execute their plan on how to victim-

ize them. "Use that against them," Boch said.

If folks interrupt that bad guy's OODA loop and the perpetrator decides to find a softer, easier target - that counts as a win. An even better win than if you pulled out your gun at the last possible moment and shot down a mope as they attacked with a weapon.



Another retired military officer and tactics professor from the US Army War College added that ordinarily, bad guys do "X" and expect their victims to do "Y" and the process continues until they are upon their victim, committing the attack. Instead of reacting, the old colonel said to do unexpected things - and not just one or two. Put the bad guy on the defensive, so again, they'll be motivated to pursue other targets of opportunity.

That might mean using a very loud and assertive command voice telling them to stay back, or it might involve ducking into a neighborhood

bar filled with people instead of going into that nearly desolate, marginally-lit parking garage after you notice one or more potential bad guys tailing you.

Boch added that it's not hard to spot potential wolves among the sheep if you're used to surveying your environment regularly. Bad guys too are watching the people - only they're looking mostly for easy victims. But they will notice a fellow predator - in this case a sheepdog. Unless they are desperate, the smart bad guys will steer clear of the situationally aware individual, especially one with a command presence in his or her body language. Otherwise the bad guy(s) know they might spring a leak or get arrested.

You don't have to look like a Navy SEAL to have bad guys look past you as a victim in their OODA loop looking for victims. You merely have to look more aware than the skinny-jeans and flip flop wearing guy with his face buried in his phone and earbuds in his ears.

Drummond also noted that it's hard to teach "mindset" among people. If you have the mindset of a victim, you're probably going to become a victim sooner or later.

Why do I have guns? Because of people like Taylor Lorenz

by Tom Knighton (Townhall) - Former New York Times and Washington Post "journalist" Taylor Lorenz is not a very good person, but I want to start by making it very clear that the headline is not a threat against her. I wish her absolutely no physical or even psychological harm from any kind of violent encounter.

No, I carry a gun because of people like her, but not so much because I'm looking to hurt them.

I'm looking to make sure me and mine don't get hurt by the kind of people who want to impress people like her.

As you may have heard, Lorenz embarrassed herself by fawning over United-Healthcare CEO Brian Thompson's alleged killer. Luigi Mangione reportedly shot Thompson with a privately made firearm with a privately made suppressor on the streets of one of the most anti-gun cities in the country.

Mangione is someone that, apparently, many women find to be a good-looking guy. He doesn't do it for me, but then again, dudes never will.

Lorenz, however, celebrated the murder

from the start, and in her latest comments during an interview with CNN, she literally called Mangione "moral."

Yes, the guy accused of killing another, who Lorenz believes did it, was the moral one.

A lot of people agree with her.

This is sick and twisted, especially as this kind of celebratory attitude encourages others to kill people they disagree with or simply don't like because they did something "bad..."

And now we know what Lorenz wants to see happen to "bad people."

In this day and age, there are a ton of people who think like this. They're the people firebombing Tesla dealerships or plotting to kill President Donald Trump or Pennsylvania Gov. Josh Shapiro because they don't like what they believe these people represent.

People like Lorenz celebrate the murder of people they don't like, which feeds into the idea that the ends justify even the most violent means. It doesn't matter whether there are non-violent means available; they still support violence





Chicago PD de-authorizes Sig P320s

Chicago (Crime File News) - In a move that's rocking the rank and file, the Chicago Police Department has abruptly banned the use of the once-trusted Sig/Sauer P320 pistol as an authorized duty weapon. The order came down swiftly, leaving thousands of officers scrambling. The official reason? Alarming reports that the weapon can fire without the trigger being pulled.

For years now the gun-maker has brushed off horror stories about negligent discharges, usually blaming human error. After all, it's easier to blame the gun than admit to a deadly mistake...

The Sig Sauer P320 has a documented pattern of discharges—many occurring while holstered. Lawsuits are piling up, and the manufacturer continues to deny fault, but the incidents are too numerous, too consistent, and too dangerous to ignore.

In a city already struggling to staff its police force and control spiraling violence, CPD brass made the call: better to pull the plug than risk another injury or death. The P320 is now officially de-authorized.

A new Cook Co. State's Attorney that actually wants to keep violent criminals off the streets?

Problem-plagued electronic monitoring program has become 'a serious threat to public safety' top Cook County prosecutor says

Chicago (CWB Chicago)
—Cook County's electronic
monitoring program has
become "a serious threat
to public safety" because
the office of Chief Judge
Timothy Evans, which
recently assumed responsibility for its operation, is not
equipped or prepared to
handle it.

That's not us talking. That's Cook County State's Attorney Eileen O'Neill Burke (pictured), who instructed the county's prosecutors to publicly object anytime a judge places a defendant on an ankle monitor instead of granting the state's request to keep them in jail.

After years of effort, Cook County Sheriff Tom Dart successfully transferred responsibility for the electronic monitoring program on April 1. Dart has repeatedly



said the county is misusing the program by putting violent and dangerous offenders on ankle monitors when the system was designed for low-level offenses like drug possession.

Evans' office has operated a separate electronic monitoring program for many years, but it has generally been used for defendants who are given nighttime curfews, not for 24/7 monitoring.

In a memo to her staff, O'Neill Burke said Evans' electronic monitoring staff members are not law enforcement officers, and they cannot make arrests. If an electronic monitoring participant goes AWOL, the top prosecutor said, Evans' staff must "call 911 or seek assistance from law enforcement" and then take the matter to court.



STOP BUYING MORE GUNS

(GSL) - Nobody wants to get killed by a criminal. Most of us who own or carry guns do so to defend ourselves and our families from violent criminal attack.

Too many new and long-time gun owners alike fall for advertising hype and wishful thinking that suggests if you just buy this new pistol/rifle/shotgun, you'll become a master class shooter without trying. In the end, too many folks just end up with a big collection of guns and a lack of skill sets needed to use any of them well for personal defense.

Stop falling for that hype. If you're essentially a collector seeking the Holy Grail of guns, stop. Quite honestly, buying another gun doesn't make you a better defensive shooter any more than buying another fire extinguisher makes you a better firefighter.

It takes a little bit of time, effort and yes, money to learn modern defensive pistolcraft. You can't get it for free by watching hip hop and Tik Tok videos, or buy pulling out the plastic to buy the latest, greatest new tactical wondergun.



Like learning to swim, defensive shooting skills can save your life. People spend crazy time and money on their golf game or other pricey hobbies like attending professional sports. Many of these same people won't spend a weekend or two learning how to avoid or survive a criminal attack. It's easier to tell themselves the threat of crime doesn't really exist or that it always happens to someone else, somewhere else.

They will buy that new gun and have no holster to keep their latest pistol securely on their body. A carry rig that allows safe drawing and reholstering without muzzling yourself or those around you. I recommend Safariland ALS retention holsters but many good kydex holsters will work if they'll keep the gun in the holster. Of course any carry rig that will allow your gun to slip out and fall into the blue water of a hot porta-potty when you drop your pants should be a nogo for you. And stay away from Blackhawk "Serpa" holsters.

Your "carry belt" should be at least 1.5" wide

and stiff enough to support the weight of your Roscoe and gear. It's gonna cost a few bucks too but it'll last until it shrinks in the dryer.

Buy a couple of magazine pouches to hold your extra magazines securely. Speaking of which, make sure you have a minimum of three magazines, and four is much better.

Other supplies needed? Buy electronic ear protection to help you hear your instructor(s) during range time. Shooting glasses with wrap-around protection offer the greatest eye protection, and buy an extra pair. One is none. Two is one. Three is one and a spare.

Now that you have your pistol and support gear, start looking to begin your education into the art of modern pistolcraft.

There are highly-skilled and experienced instructors out there. Sadly, the majority are neither. Look for highly respected, well-trained instructors - ones who can communicate well to those new to shooting. Research them. Do they have a website? Pictures will often tell the tale of how many people they're training and how they do it. Is poor muzzle control or other questionable safety issues shown in the pictures?

Read reviews from their students and talk with their past students.

Look for instructors who continue their education and who carry everyday, not those teaching theoreticals or who think they know everything already because they drove a tank or truck in the Army long ago.



Team teaching and plentiful instructors in a class are a huge good sign. As are courses that go well beyond mandated minimums.

Once you've learned the basics at some good classes, you can seek out more advanced instruction from nationally-known instructors to further refine your basic skills sets, eliminate wasted movement and advance your mastery of a life-skill that can save your life and that of your loved ones.

The bottom line: Do you want to be a more competent shooter or just a prolific accumulator of guns?



Stop chasing that new magical pistol that will make you look cooler, more tacticool and most importantly, better looking to the opposite sex. Along with everything else those marketing departments try to make you believe.

Quality training from dedicated, skilled instructors costs some money and some time.

Get over it. Spend the money - after all, you can't take it with you if you die. That goes double if you die because some mope killed you after failed to notice their approach or you did something really stupid like trying to defend property with deadly force... or drew your own gun on a bad guy already pointing his gun at you.



You've probably heard that in a critical situation, you will never "rise to the occasion" but instead you will default to your level of training. It's so very true.

If you don't even know what you don't know, you may find yourself in the loss column against even a rookie punk adversary.

On a side note, by taking classes, you will meet other high-quality, like-minded individuals. These people might even become friends - good friends - the kind of friends who can save your life or help you move.

And who can't use more like-minded friends, particularly those with critical life skills and a willingness to help? Of course, you have to reciprocate, but it's time well spent with people you like.

Out front of the boarded up fire department we walked up to a couple of men who turned out to be volunteer firefighters. Ever curious, I asked about what happened.

In short, they had a lot of rain ahead of Helene. Then hurricane winds toppled trees into power and phone lines, snapped utility poles and tore up a lot of roofs. Flying debris broke a lot of windows too. Of course cell phone service stopped.

Along with the winds, Helene dumped about 20" to 30" of rain in the span of a day and a half. Floodwaters from the river running adjacent to the town flooded "Main Street" with 12 to 15 feet of water, rising at a rate of an inch or two per minute. Those who didn't leave early on found themselves stuck and their cars destroyed (see photo at top of story).

In the span of hours, the

region as a whole became blockaded. For two, three or sometimes four days stranded motorists found themselves forced to "camp out" in their vehicles. Roads and Interstates were blocked with trees, wrecks, washouts - and cars that ran out of gas. By the third day, those motorists without any provisions like extra water or snacks were very miserable, especially after they ran out of gas. Some drank contaminated water and became sick, others suffered issues from going without their prescription medications for

The local fire department on Main Street wisely moved their large apparatus to the hills overlooking the town ahead of Helene. They lost most everything else on the first floor.

Police and fire radio communications were degraded. Those without radios (Amateur, GMRS, CB or otherwise) were completely cut off from communicating with others.

It took about five days for the first fuel to arrive... for first responders. It took a few more days for fuels for commercial sale to arrive.

Adding to that, inept state officials limited access in and out in some regions to help promote "safety."

Biden/Harris' FEMA didn't ride to the rescue either. Instead, volunteers, veterans groups and local people came together and made all the difference in facilitating the recovery and looking out for those most impacted.

While many got power restored in a week or two, some of the more rural properties had to wait as long as 10 weeks. That was with utility linemen and their trucks coming from hundreds of miles around to help.

Once fuel trucks made it in to some places, people often waited for an hour or more for a ration. Sometimes people lined up for hours on a mere rumor that a gas truck was coming. And it

Mistakes made.

One guy said he failed to fuel up his F250 pickup truck ahead of the impending storm. "Silly me. I had 40 miles of fuel when I set out looking a way out to get to my relatives' place in Virginia to get supplies and fuel.' Silly him, indeed. In the end, given the plentiful road obstructions, he didn't need 40 miles of driving to figure out he wasn't leaving town.

The other guy? He had a generator for power outages. But he only had two gallons of fuel besides the generator's tank and he ended up using much of that in a chainsaw to clear trees on his property and on nearby roads. "I ran out three days into it. I had several gas cans, but they were all empty. They aren't empty

At least he learned from his mistakes. Speaking of learning: The few who didn't have a generator before the storm pretty much all have one now. Some have two. Most have ample spare fuel now and other storm cleanup gear including chainsaws.

One wonders if the stranded motorists learned to keep several bottles of water in their car along with some shelf-stable foods or snacks. Lifeboat rations will keep a person going for three days easy. Peanuts and trail mix are stable enough to store in your car. Or you can throw in an MRE or two if you're hard-core. Flashlights, batteries, work gloves, comfy boots or shoes and some dry clothes might also be good things to have in your car (or in your kids' car). A wool blanket would be a smart addition too. Medications might also come in very handy too, especially critical prescription meds.

Those with a modicum of emergency preparedness weathered the days following the torrential rain and hurricane winds much better as a whole, either in their storm-battered homes or in their cars. They could tend to self-care and disaster recovery instead of worrying about finding some food and water - along with fuel. The prepared could communicate with their friends and family, and coordinate their efforts. They could also listen to radio reports as well. The unprepared were miserable, cold, thirsty, hungry and in some cases sick.

Which subset of people do you wish to place yourself and your family? Team "Refugee" or Team Prepared? The choice is yours to make.


Big Media falls to a(nother) record low in public trust





What is wrong with these people?

SURVEY: 55% of self-identified Leftists say killing Trump is justifiable (The Federalist) - The unhinged left, fueled nation — among younger, highly online,

(The Federalist) - The unhinged left, fueled by Trump Derangement Syndrome and seething hatred for Elon Musk, is trending more violent, according to a new study that finds political violence targeting President Donald Trump and his billionaire adviser is "becoming increasingly normalized."

The report, produced by the Network of Contagion Research Institute (NCRI) in partnership with Rutgers University's Social Perception Lab, finds a broader "assassination culture" appears to be "emerging within segments of the U.S. public on the extreme left, with expanding targets now including figures such as Donald Trump."

Less than a year after assassination attempts on then-presidential candidate Trump and the literally explosive violence against Musk's Tesla electric vehicles, it's no secret that leftists are ratcheting up violent rhetoric and actions. The more troubling trend is that an "assassination culture" isn't just coming from the "fringe" left

"These attitudes are not fringe — they reflect an emergent assassination culture, grounded in far-left authoritarianism and increasingly normalized in digital discourse," states the report, titled, "Assassination Culture: How Burning Teslas and Killing Billionaires Became a Meme Aesthetic for Political Violence."

"The findings signal a threat to political stability and public safety," the reports warns.

'Widespread Justification for Lethal Violence'

NCRI, an independent institution working to "identify and forecast emerging threats in the era of information disorder," finds the pattern is building on a broader trend discussed in two reports in December that analyzed "how viral social media narratives were legitimizing political violence, particularly in the aftermath of the United Healthcare CEO's assassination."

"The reports found widespread justification for lethal violence — including assassi-

nation — among younger, highly online, and ideologically left-aligned users," the authors of the latest study write.



Here are some of the troubling numbers, according to the report:

Murder Justification: 31% and 38% of respondents stated it would be at least somewhat justified to murder Elon Musk and President Trump, respectively. (These effects were largely driven by respondents that self-identified as left of center, with 48% and 55% at least somewhat justifying murder for Elon Musk and President Trump, respectively, indicating significantly higher justification for violence against these figures.)

Property Destruction: Nearly 40% of respondents (39.8%) stated it is at least somewhat acceptable (or more) to destroy a Tesla dealership in protest.

Psychological/Ideological Correlations with Assassination Culture: These beliefs are highly correlated with one another, as well as with the justification of the murder of the UnitedHealthcare CEO and hyper-partisan left-wing ideology. (This suggests that support for violence is part of a broader assassination culture, underpinned by psychological and ideological factors.)

ACTUAL GUN SAFETY... Once again, Illinois is an outlier

More and more states creating formal student firearm safety & education programs

(NRA-ILA) - Providing firearm safety training opportunities to school-aged children is not a novel concept, although utilizing legislative solutions is a newer approach to this old idea. Prior to the 1970s, it was quite standard nationwide for schools to provide variations of firearm or hunter-related safety courses as part of their curriculums. Unfortunately, a trend emerged of polarizing politics over educational merit, and most formalized firearm safety educational opportunities for our nation's youth had been extinguished in schools by the early 2000s.

As legislative sessions hit their crossover marks and begin to wind down in many states, it has been refreshing to see renewed trends and traction in legislative efforts to help reintroduce the concept of youth firearm safety in schools to address this critical knowledge gap. This year alone, there have been various renditions of bills introduced among the states ranging from mandatory to optional training with varied and scalable models utilizing firearm and hunter safety components. A few states to note:

Georgia's HB 451 would allow public schools to offer hunter safety education courses in grades six through twelve.

In Kansas, HB 2104 aims to standardize firearm safety education programs in school districts, with the goal of promoting student safety and teaching appropriate responses when encountering firearms.

Michigan HB 4285 would mandate the development and availability of a model firearm safety instruction program for students in grades six through twelve with topics covered to include proper firearm usage, safe handling, different types of firearms, and safe hunting practices.

In Utah, Governor Cox signed a bill that would make gun safety lessons mandatory for students.

Also, last month Arkansas Governor Sarah Sanders signed Act 229 into law, which requires public and open enrollment public charter schools to provide age-appropriate firearm safety instruction beginning during the 2025-2026 school year.

The aim of these laws is to educate and protect children, clear and simple. Demonizing the ever-increasing community of lawful and safe gun owners by way of caricature in media does not help keep children safe. The very best defense against the weakening of our Second Amendment rights is instilling the next generation with the knowledge, skills, and abilities necessary in a culture where firearms are a normal and accepted part of life. These legislative efforts to bring back firearm safety education to schools are an important downpayment not just on safety but on restoring and reaffirming America's traditional values in education.

MA gun club defeats the US Army in 'Landmark' range access lawsuit

(Shooting News Weekly)
- A small civilian gun club located just 50 miles northwest of Boston has won a "landmark" lawsuit against nearby Fort Devens for violating their rights and federal law by denying them access to military rifle ranges at reasonable rates.

The Fort Devens Rifle & Pistol Club, Inc., filed suit in 2022 claiming that Fort officials were charging range fees in violation of federal law, according to club treasurer Jim Gettens, a retired attorney who assisted with the legal fight.

Gettens said Monday that his club's victory was a major "David vs. Goliath" event.

"They were running an illegal profiteering racket," he



said. "That's the best way to describe it. This was a landmark case." Gettens and other club members noticed that their problems with the range began only three days after Joe Biden took office in 2022, which they said would never have happened under President Donald Trump's administration.

At issue was a little-known section of U.S. code that requires the Army to make rifle and pistol ranges available for civilian use as long as it does not interfere with military training. The law prohibits officials from charging exorbitant fees for range access.






Are you a man of fewer, standardized calibers?

A man of few calibers

I have two good friends.
We shoot and go hunting
together sometimes. Each
knows the other well and
they are friends too. Both
my friends have two very
different ways of looking at
firearms.

Joe has just about every caliber gun you could imagine from the diminutive .25 ACP up to the elephant-dropping .455 Lott. If Joe likes a firearm, he buys it. It doesn't matter what caliber or gauge it is. We often tease him because he doesn't have a punt gun yet!

Guns are working art by themselves and Joe has many beautiful works of art. One can never have too many guns but what about too many calibers?

Meanwhile Larry has just two calibers .45 Colt and .410. Over the years Larry's collection has grown very little. When Larry comes shooting he brings the same couple guns.

Larry has a snubbie 5-shot .45LC caliber revolver for his carry gun. A lever gun chambered in the same .45LC takes care of larger game. Moreover, he uses his .410 Remington 1100 for his small game hunting. The only newer gun he has is the Taurus Judge revolving carbine rifle and that's the extent of Larry's gun collection.

When we go shooting or hunting, Joe never brings the same caliber or gun. Sometimes he'll bring common caliber guns, other times he brings rarer specimens, like a Ruger in .204. Joe says, "Each caliber has a purpose and I like to change it up when we shoot".

We all hunt all manner of furry woodland critters and birds. Larry does just fine with his .410 despite squirrels, rabbits, pheasants, turkeys, ducks and geese with shotguns. Joe uses what he thinks is "an appropriate gauge for the game" while Larry hunts with his .410 shotgun and 45LC rifle. He uses his lever action rifle to hunt larger game like yotes and deer. Next season Larry wants to hunt with his new Judge. I think it would be cool to hunt with it!

I've asked Larry why he uses a .410 and not some other gauge like the ubiquitous 12ga.? He told me, "I like a low weight fast handling shotgun and the light recoil the .410 has". He takes just as much game as I do with my 16 gauge. Larry hammers ducks and on more than one occasion has outshot Joe with his 10 gauge!

Mr. "Man of Few Calibers" Larry reloads. Joe does not. Larry has boxes of his two favorite calibers always loaded and ready to go. And his reloading table is so neat and orderly.

On the other hand, Joe does not reload. Joe's ammo collection is a mish mosh of brands, half filled boxes of this and that. Sometimes Joe has to stop shooting some of his firearms for lack of ammo

Larry has resisted the temptation to acquire other caliber or gauges. He told me, "I'm very happy with the calibers I have chosen and don't see the need for anything else." Intimately knowing your firearm, what it can and can't do means your proficiency and accuracy will increase. Which is evident as Larry usually out scores us both when target shooting.

I can see both friends' points of view. After all, I have many different calibers and gauges but nowhere near what Joe has. I like getting something new every once in a while and don't mind having so many different calibers but I really like Larry's take in keeping it simple and using a caliber that you really enjoy. Sometimes I think about downsizing my calibers into a more manageable size like Joe.

What calibers do you have? Which camp do you fall into, are you a Larry, Joe or do you fall somewhere in between like me?

PICA moved self-defense back to the 19th Century in the Land of Lincoln

Lever Actions: A PICA Alternative?

(GSL) - Over the last few years, there has been a niche market for "tactical" lever action rifles featuring M-lok rails, lights, red dots, and furniture mounted ammunition carriers. Before PICA, I dismissed this marketing technique as a novelty. In short, it was my opinion was that dressing up a lever action with "tacticool" accessories was like wearing a tuxedo to a square dance.

Since the rise of the Illinois 2A iron curtain, I have had to take a second look at these modernized lever guns. The lever action is one of the fastest cycling manual actions available on the market today.

Looking at the lever gun market choices offered to oppressed Land of Lincoln residents, these are divided into two groups: rifle caliber lever guns, and Lever Action Pistol Caliber Carbines (LAPCC).

Rifle caliber offerings are a trade-off. You get exponentially more fire power at the sacrifice of ammunition capacity and an increased distance on the lever throw to accommodate the longer cartridge. These powerful rounds are not practical for home defense, because not only will it punch a hole through an intruder, it may punch a hole in your innocent neighbor two houses down as well.

LAPCC are better suited for personal defense. A LAPCC carries twice the magazine capacity in calibers that are less likely to unintentionally harm the neighbors. Their tubular magazines hold a capacity of 10-15 rounds. By comparison, PICA-legal semi-auto PCC options are supposed to be limited to ten anyway.

Not only that, but if revolvers are you thing, you can standardize your ammo. For example, a .357 Magnum lever gun hits like a truck and that .357 revolver on your hip is nothing to sneeze at either.

There are other offerings in the LAPCC market recently, mostly following the Model 92 design. Most of these have not been on the market long enough to prove their reliability nor are their warranty details made well known. So, let's just stick with the established manufacturers.

Henry: Henry has a variety of lever offerings in various calibers. Quality and customer service are superior. Take pride in buying American. Henry spends a lot of advertising dollars telling you about these features. With such a large advertising budget, you're going to pay premium prices for a run of the mill pistol caliber lever gun with better value options out there.

Marlin: Now owned by Ruger, Marlin quality has returned to their historical standards; American made. The action is smooth, fit

and finish are superior. I have competed with a Marlin in Cowboy Action Shooting. I've seen matches won with Marlins; I like Marlins. They are competitive out of the box. Average retail is around \$1000.

Rossi: Lifetime guaranteed by Taurus, the Rossi Model 92 has been around for decades. I started Cowboy Shooting with a Rossi. While my Rossi is semi-retired, I still love to carry it on my property for coyotes and protection from any two-legged predatory mammals. Its light weight balances beautifully. It has a compact receiver that I can wrap my hand around while carrying it. Budget priced around \$700. While quality has gotten better, to get peak performance from this model the action needs polished, and the springs need lightened. The running joke on the Cowboy range was to "Shoot it like you're mad at it." The last 3/8" of lever throw pops the lifter into place. If you fail to bump the end of the action called short cycling - you fail to feed the next round. This results in a "click" instead of "bang".

Uberti: Italian made imports, replicas of the 1860 Henry, Winchester 1866 and 1873. Not cheap; retail starts around \$1200 before another \$600-\$700 in after-market modifications. These are preferred by Cowboy Action shooters for good reason, their toggle link design, dating back to the 19th century, are readily adapted to run fast. In the early 2000s Uberti dominated the Cowboy Action market, so when the modifications started to evolve, Ubertis were the predominant platform for which the after-market parts were designed to fit. This prevalence carries on today. The modified platform starts with a short-stroke kit. These kits shorten the lever throw by 30-35%. Performing the same amount of work with less leverage, other modifications must be made to keep the action smooth and effortless. This requires the replacement of several springs, the removal of mass from internal parts, and the tuning the whole package. In cases of drastic modifications, this forces competitors to reload using the softest of primers.

The result: a trained operator can affix his thumb to the side of the receiver and work the action by pivoting the wrist while flicking his middle ring and pinky fingers; setting the index finger to trip the trigger as the hand swings back. A trained shooter using this technique can run the action fast enough to confuse bystanders to believe that the shooter is using a semi-auto.

Rich in American history, the lever gun is an icon to firearms evolution. While PICA has set long gun options back to the 19th century, the modern market still allows these relics to be viable choices in self-defense options, including for playing cowboys and terrorists.

Communication, coordination, calling for help and so much more...

Create your own radio network

by John Boch

The best preparedness strategies leverage dual-purpose items for use in both good times and in emergencies. For instance, rain barrels virtue signal your "green" bona fides to nosy neighbors, while at the same time discretely storing 50 gallons of water suitable for filtration and drinking if the public water supply fails.

Modern hand-held radios share this dual-purpose role too. Family outings and events, vacation trips, hunting trips and group endeavors can all benefit from a common, easy-to-use radio network unifying the participants with instant communications. Sure, most adults and teens have a cell phone, but you can't instantly notify everyone with a cell phone, even if everyone had a decent cellular signal

Today's hand-held radios are affordable, powerful, lightweight, compact and easy to use. Moreover, some frequencies don't even require any FCC licensing!

No, you're not going to communicate 30+ miles between hand-held radios without some fancy hardware between them. In the real world, those Walmart or Bass Pro FRS bubble-pack radios will get you a half-mile - 880 yards - on a really good day.

Instead, buy \$25ish Baofeng UV-5R radios with a better quality whip antennas. Unlock them then program them for the Multi-Use Radio System (MURS - no license required). With these you can communicate *reliably* for a mile plus, and under better conditions, twice that isn't unheard of.

If that's a family hike, tourist stop or a trip to the amusement park, or kids playing in the neighborhood, that's probably enough of coverage to keep everyone in the loop.

For more mobile applications, like a group road trip or a shopping trip when utilities are down and looters might be out, instant communication between vehicles will prove a big aid to safely and efficiently conducting your business.

To further expand your handheld's reach when in a car, buy \$20-30 external, magnetic mount antenna for each vehicle. Screw that into your walkie-talkie antenna jack, plant the magnetic mount on the roof, and you're golden for two miles easy, and four on many flat Interstates in IL. Closer to home.

In your neighborhood, nearby residents with radios can help coordinate damage assessment and storm recovery - and security - especially if cell phones are down or swamped with people trying to call friends and family.

Moreover, depending on your local public safety radio frequencies and radio types, you may still be able to monitor your local police, fire, EMS and weather spotters with the UV-5R, thanks to its scanner function.

With a \$35 10-year General Mobile Radio Service (GMRS) radio license, you can legally use the GMRS frequencies. Even better, your entire household can use that license call sign. The application process is fairly easy and you'll have the license within a couple of business days.

With that license, you can access the GMRS band's public radio repeaters to greatly expand the range of your hand-helds.

Repeaters (aka "machines" in the radio world) are radios connected to tall antennas. They receive communication on one frequency and rebroadcast it on another frequency, blanketing an area 10-, 20- or even 60-plus miles around it, depending in large part on the antenna height. Yes, Virginia, your UV-5R can use repeaters!

Many of these machines are completely open to anyone with a license. The better ones are "private" (they aren't cheap to set up for the owners) but the owners will often grant permission if you request it. Visit MyGMRS.com for a list of repeaters, public and private and to request permissions.

There are some rules about transmitting (no profanity, you must use your radio call sign and you can't use "codes") but to reach your other friends if cell phones go down, these repeaters can make all the difference to share information, ask for assistance or to meet up with like-minded friends. Again, all for less than a hundred bucks and a minor learning curve

Help your friends, family and neighbors with the learning curve. Help them to purchase and program appropriate radios. Establish a common frequency for recreational and/or emergency use, and just like that you will be helping to build a network of friends for good times and bad.



A 10-pack of UV-5R radios is only \$169 at Amazon as of publication.

As the Red Cross or Ready. gov might suggest, during an emergency you can monitor the radio for others' wellbeing and check on them via the radio instead of knocking on their door. You can also summon assistance, especially if you're less-abled with age, infirmity, or injuries.

Contact your local emergency management people for advice and guidance from them. They might be willing to share some knowledge and resources. These include channels where weather spotters communicate for the latest during severe weather.

Feel overwhelmed? Not technologically skilled? You can teach old dogs new tricks. YouTube has great resources for learning how to use radios, including the basics and beyond. Learn at your own speed.



Scores of videos like this one on YouTube will coach you in using your radio.

Building your family's preparedness skill sets with knowledge and some affordable equipment not only can pay off in good times, but it can come in handy and then some for genuine emergencies. Ditto for including likeminded neighbors. The bigger your network of friends, the easier disaster recovery will become for all of you.

Secure your radios NOW. Get on this now before tariffs double or triple the price of these radios! After all, they virtually all come from China and as of this writing, the tariffs stand at 125% - and even higher for de minimus orders.

What can radios do for you?

Remember what happened to General George Armstrong Custer? He went out one day and left his Gatling guns back at the fort. He didn't think he would need them. That fateful decision didn't work out well for him.

While Gatling Guns aren't regulated by Illinois' gun and magazine ban (don't give them any ideas), one thing that's a lot cheaper and more accessible is two-way radio communications.

We've covered this in the last couple of issues of *Gun-News*. And we've had some good conversations behind the scenes.



"What can a radio do for

me?" is a common question. Along with its close cousin, "Why go to the trouble?"

In a nutshell: knowledge is power during good times and bad. Especially during a local, regional or national emergency.

When cell phones go down for whatever reason, or access to cellular service is restricted to public safety workers, radios allow you to communicate with others without using smoke signals of drums.



Even in normal times, these radios can monitor local weather watchers and trained weather spotters when severe weather approaches. By listening to their reports, you will know real-time the latest on the exact location of the worst threats. That alone is worth buying these radios.

If things go sideways, you can learn where and what sort of help is needed. With comms, you can learn places to avoid because of criminal activity or first responder activity.

Moreover, you will have an opportunity to summon assistance too, in the form of physical assistance, additional information, or much needed supplies.

Neighborhood use.

With a hand-held radio, you can reach select neighbors within a mile or so if you've set up a designated frequency amongst yourselves. If someone in your neighborhood area has erected a taller antenna (20' to 30', for instance), they will be able to reach people several miles away. Height is might when it comes to radio transmissions and reception.

Comms will help the prepared folks with damage assessment and/or recovery efforts at the neighborhood level.

They will also allow the

neighbors to talk back and forth as they venture out seeking needed stuff or helping others. And if travelling/ evacuating as a group, the vehicles can communicate with one another so they can work together more effectively and safely.



Of course, there's the obvious use of the radios to report on looters or potential looters in the neighborhood.

MURS, or the Multi-Use Radio System, might be a good band for local comms. No license is required. Designate a channel for your network of friends and neighbors. The exact five frequencies can be found at online search engines. We recommend picking a standard subaudible tone to vastly reduce annoying "interference." Put your google skills to work for how to program those tones with the radio(s) of your choice.



Neighbors can share information on availability of fuel, food, medications and disaster recovery supplies at various stores. That surely beats burning precious fuel driving around searching blindly.



Along those same lines if the power or credit card readers are down, knowing where to find stores are still open for business will save time and effort. Ditto for gas stations.



For really good friends in the neighborhood on your radio network, you might be able to finagle borrowing power tools or needed supplies to complete emergency repairs. Maybe even a generator.



City/County use.

Using repeaters, you and your friends can trade information like above only over a *much* larger geographic area. This, however, will require a \$35 General Mobile Radio Service (GMRS) license from the FCC. This 10-year license covers your entire family!

With that license and a repeater you have permission to use, you can check on the well-being of your family members for peace of mind-if they have a radio and know which channels/repeater the family will use for comms.

These can also help moms and dads (and maybe grand-parents) coordinate pickup of kiddos from school or elsewhere to help make sure they get home safe. Or to help younger kiddos find mom, dad or other trusted adults.

Imagine how valuable it would be to communicate with your preparedness friends across town or in the next suburb or maybe even in the next county to ask for assistance or to offer help.

Having a way to reach out to friendlies to come help you and/or your family with critical supplies might prove helpful.



For those evacuating larger cities (like Chicago), the repeaters can allow users to meet up in order to travel together as there's safety in numbers. Those retreating from urban chaos can share better routes or places to avoid for whatever reason, along with locations to fuel up and obtain food.

To get the full potential out of these repeater machines, you will need a mobile unit for your car. A walkie-talkie, even the UV-5R, simply doesn't have the horsepower (wattage) to reach out to the full range of the repeater.

Sure, you can hear most transmissions on an HT at a distance, but others may not be able to make out your transmissions clearly beyond maybe ten or fifteen miles, depending on a number of factors.



Retevis has a nice mobile radio unit for \$125 (current).

A mobile unit, pushing out 25 watts on a better antenna (vs. 5-7 watts on a hand-held with a marginal antenna) will allow you to get the range you need. And in some cases, that might allow you to communicate sixty plus miles with some of the big repeaters connected to antennas mounted hundreds of feet in the air.

But again, these require a GMRS license to use legally.

The legal disclaimer: We hate to do this, but we've already received some comments about "some of this isn't exactly 100% legal." It's kinda like concealed means concealed, folks.

Using these Chinese radios for communications *may* run afoul of *some* FCC regs in *certain* circumstances. Operate responsibly and 99.9999944% of the time you'll be fine, particularly during emergencies.

Many of these rules are like speed limits. Only in this case the FCC may have only a dozen traffic cops for the whole nation. These enforcement people investigate prolific, malicious idiots interfering with public safety and business band radios. The FCC's not interested in Joe Sixpack using his UV-5R on an FRS channel "illegally" because he has a removable antenna on his HT.

Just don't act recklessly or maliciously by interfering with others' use of radio frequencies, use crude profanity or act like a jackwagon on air and you'll be unmolested by Mr. FCC.

The bottom line: Knowledge is power, especially during emergencies. Portable radios help keep you informed.



Florida 'woman' face charges after pointing gun, threatening to blow the brains out of teens fishing in backyard pond

Melbourne, FL (WESH) — A Melbourne woman has been arrested and charged after allegedly holding two teenagers at gunpoint for fishing near her backyard, according to police.

Donna Elkins, 59, called 911 to notify dispatch that two boys were in her backyard fishing, according to an arrest report. She told deputies she walked into the backyard with a pellet gun in an attempt to scare them, the report states.

We spoke with the 15-year-old, Brayden, by phone Tuesday.

"We turned around, and she was holding a rifle and telling us she was going to blow our heads off," Brayden said. He took a video of the encounter with Elkins. "She was making us get down on the ground and saying, 'What makes you think you can come on my property?' And she was saying that if we did come on

her property, she could blow our brains

[Elkins] was charged with two counts of aggravated assault and two counts of false imprisonment.

[Editor: You CANNOT legally shoot trespassers on your property, absent an imminent danger of death or great bodily harm to innocent life. You CAN-NOT legally point guns at trespassers absent a threat of death or great bodily injury to innocent life.



(New York Times) - Ten men, some wearing camouflage, others in vests loaded with ammunition for their AR-15 rifles, gathered under the morning shade of oak trees in Central Florida last month. They were there to learn marksmanship tactics common among Special Operation forces and elite law enforcement units.

Their instructor, Christopher Eric Roscher, an Air Force veteran, introduced himself and then led the group in prayer...

The men gathered around him were not soldiers, police officers or right-wing militia members. They were mostly civilians, including two pilots, a nurse and a construction company executive. The class's title — Full Contender Minuteman — even referred to the civilians turned soldiers of the American

In a world shaped by war, a pandemic and extreme weather, more Americans are getting ready for crisis — whether it's to fight a tyrannical government, repel an invading army or respond to a natural disaster.

They are known as prepared or professional citizens, part of a growing number of gun owners who are adapting their mind-set to uncertain and polarized times. And rather than being part of more fringe "prepper" culture, they are growing more mainstream, catered to by companies ready to offer them the tools and training to be ready.

The traditional aspects of gun ownership such as simple target shooting — are

increasingly being shelved in favor of topics like radio and medical training, night-vision shooting, drone reconnaissance, homesteading and military tactics..

Mr. Roscher began teaching firearms classes after leaving active duty in the Air Force and started his own training company, Barrel & Hatchet Trade Group, with his business partner Tyler Burke in 2020. Barrel & Hatchet also has a YouTube channel, an Instagram account, a podcast and a gear store.

The drills were framed around how students might need to act "on the worst day of your life," Mr. Roscher said, so target shooting often took place after 25-yard sprints.

Thirty-five miles southeast of the minuteman course, Danielle L. Campbell, 43, picked up a pistol at the Orlando Gun Club and fired into a paper target a few yards away. Protect Peace, the community-focused group that she helped found in 2023, would not define themselves as prepared citizens in the same way as Mr. Roscher's cohort, but they share much of the same DNA.

"I started training after my assistant was killed by a stray bullet," Ms. Campbell said, sitting in a lounge chair at the shooting club. "Before that, I always had guns, but I never trained, I never took it seriously." Her colleague was killed during a robbery in 2017, and she started firearms training soon afterward...
